

Overview of projects undertaken using Pupil Premium Funding

- Key stage 3 Literacy and Numeracy interventions including Handwriting and Reading sessions
- Provision of additional opportunities to develop attitudes and aspirations
- Mentoring packages through the use of:
 - Local Firemen
 - Business Mentors to raise awareness of Post 16 programmes and requirements
 - PSHE days to focus on pathways and opportunities
 - Pastoral team focus on PP students who are struggling to remain focused at school
 - Yr11 and 6th Form mentors and reading partners for Year 7/8 students
 - Use of wider school community including TAs
- Support for PP students to attend educational trips which will impact on their attainment
- Provision of ICT equipment to support students to complete work both at school and at home.
- Use of alternative curriculums to ensure every child achieves their potential
- Pathways meetings with PP students to the best decisions are made for Post 16 courses.
- After School support in English and Maths for individuals and small groups of students
- Additional subject specific sessions at lunchtime, after school or in school holiday time
- Withdrawing students from lessons to focus on English in small groups made possible through funding additional support coaches
- Withdrawing students from lessons to focus on Maths in small groups made possible through funding additional support coaches
- Withdrawing students from lessons to focus on English Controlled Assessments made possible through funding an additional teacher
- One-one mentoring with the school Success Coach who works with vulnerable students
- One-one mentoring with one of the school's Business Mentors
- Peer Mentoring provided by professionally trained Year 11 or Sixth Form Student Leaders
- One-one sessions with the School Counselor
- Weekend Residential experiences funded by the school to help students prepare for critical exams
- Purchasing essential curriculum equipment for students (e.g. School Uniform, PE Kit, stationery)
- Purchasing additional resources for students (e.g. workbooks, revision guides, software packages)
- Extra-curricular sessions (e.g. peripatetic music tuition) funded by the school
- Educational Visits funded by the school
- Learning Evenings for students and parents to provide additional support to help students achieve their potential
- Alternative Curriculum packages provided on a bespoke basis tailored to the needs of the individual students
- Additional support for students from Classroom Teaching Assistants (CTAs) above the normal expectation (e.g. literacy intervention, homework clubs, discovery club)
